Omaha-Council Bluffs Walk to Cure Diabetes

More than 5,000 Walkers Raised Money for Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF)

Omaha, NE (August 6, 2009) – More than 5,000 walkers representing local corporations, families, schools and other organizations participated in the 18th annual Walk to Cure Diabetes for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF). This year's Walk to Cure Diabetes was held on Saturday, August 1 at the Lewis & Clark Landing. The chapter is closing in on its goal of raising \$1 million for diabetes research and anticipates that number to rise as fundraising efforts conclude.

First National Bank was the presenting sponsor for the Walk, and Telvent/DTN was the platinum sponsor. More than 850 First National Bank employees, friends and family participated in this year's event and raised over \$225,000.

expenditures directly support research and research-related education. In fiscal year 2008, JDRF provided more than \$156 million to diabetes research and is responsible for more than \$1.3 billion in direct funding since it was founded.
