OMAHA, Neb. Programs must be implemented for the benefit of low- or moderate income individuals, families and/or communities within the First National Bank footprint, and must align with one of the following three goal areas:

First National Bank will operate two grant cycles in 2018, dedicated to specific focus areas. The first 2018 grant cycle opens on January 10 and First National Bank will accept applications from eligible nonprofit community organizations for stable housing, neighborhood revitalization and strong local economies until February 12.
