FIRST NATIONAL BANK, CITY OF OMAHA HOST ARBOR DAY TREE PLANTING CEREMONY

OMAHA, NE. April 30, 2010— First National Bank (FNB) joined with the City of Omaha today in a tree planting ceremony to celebrate Arbor Day and the bank's "green" initiatives, announced Vickie Johnson, Vice President – Business and Branch Banking, First National Bank. In attendance were Omaha Mayor Jim Suttle, who presented an Arbor Day proclamation, as well as representatives from the Arbor Day Foundation, Lanoha Nurseries and First National Bank. The 11 a.m. tree planting ceremony was located in Miller Park just north of 27th Street and Kansas Avenue.

The tree planting ceremony marks the end of a six-month "green" initiative in which First National Bank, in partnership with the Arbor Day Foundation, pledged to make a donation to the Arbor Day Foundation to plant a tree for each customer who signed up to receive electronic statements. In total, more than 11,000 new customers signed up for electronic statements, resulting in a donation to the Foundation to plant in forests in need as designated by the Foundation, including Hiawatha National Forest and Mackinaw State Forest located in Michigan, and Pike National Forest in Colorado.

"The need for more trees in our nation's forests is great, and we are thrilled to be working with First National Bank to plant trees in forests that desperately need replanting."

As our way of saying 'thank you,' we are planting 11 sycamore trees in Miller Park to represent the more than 11,000 trees that, because of our customers, are being donated to our national forests," said Johnson. "Planting these trees in Miller Park demonstrates our ongoing commitment to the enhancement of the north Omaha community, including the opening of our new branch at 50th and Ames in July. We hope these trees will be enjoyed for generations to come."

The sycamore trees were generously donated by Lanoha Nurseries, a continuing partner with First National Bank's "green" initiatives. "We are happy to be part of this Arbor Day celebration. The planting and nurturing of trees is central to our business so it makes perfect sense to help celebrate trees and educate people on their importance," said Chris Lanoha, Vice President, Lanoha Nurseries.
